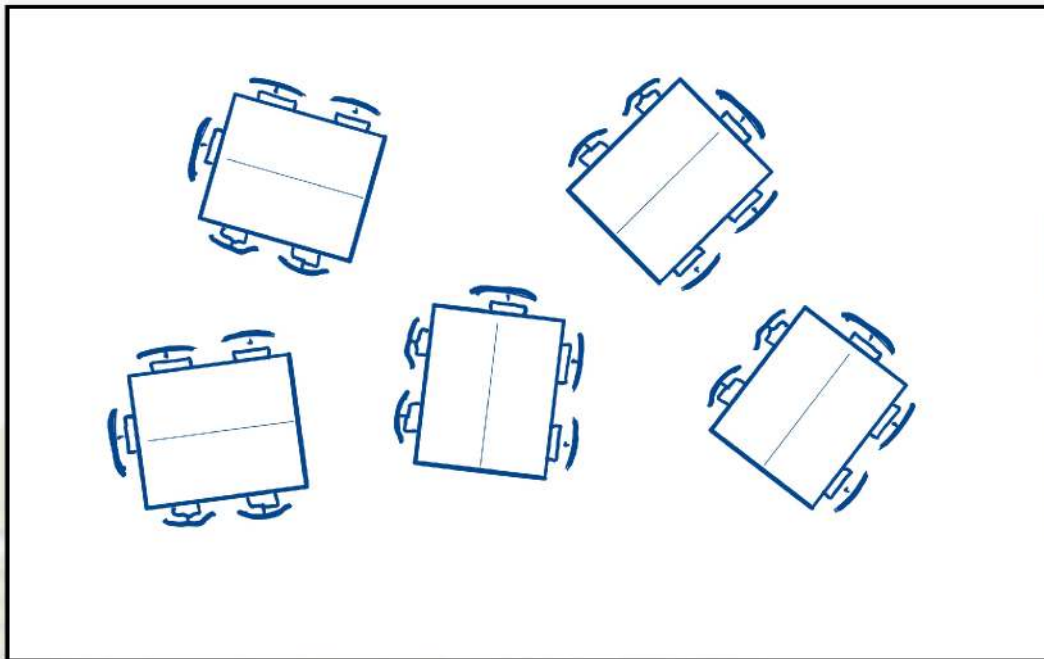

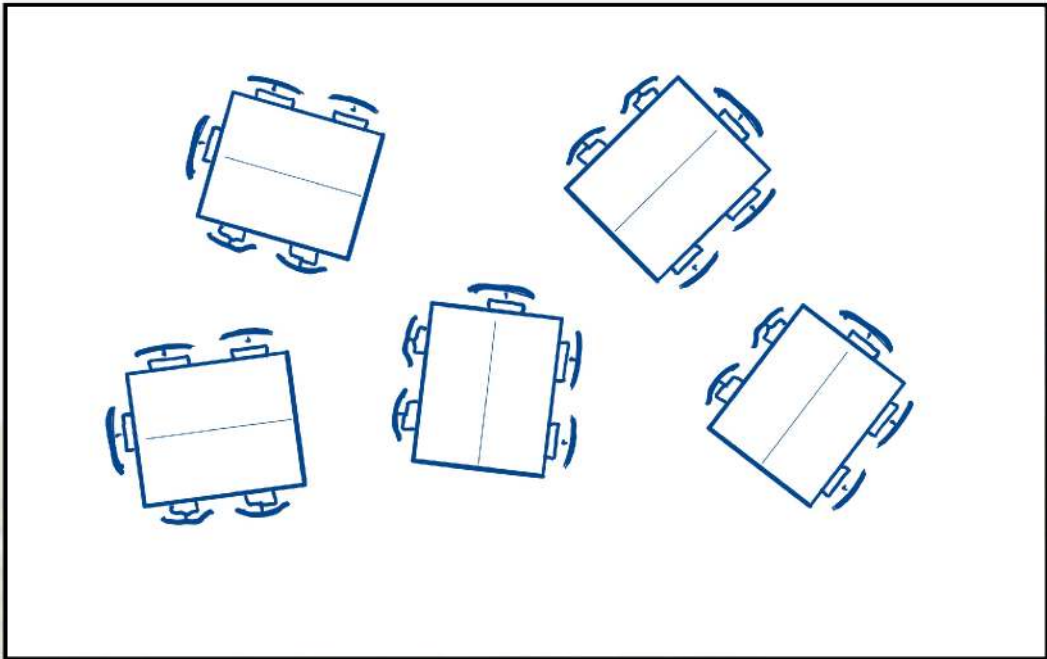

- Spend lot of time in endless refinement sessions?



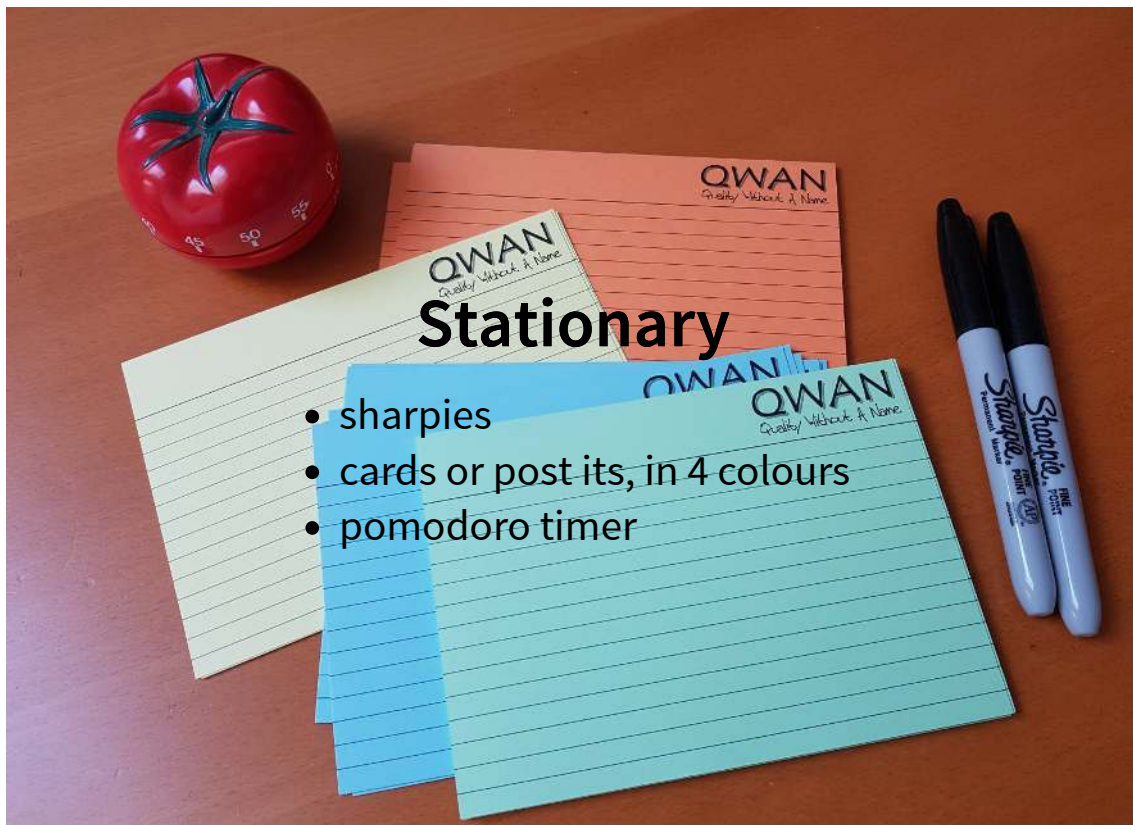
Testers

The story

Confirm Order 

As a Thirsty Client
I want to confirm my order
So that I can enjoy my drinks

On the flipside

Acceptance Criteria:

- order contains alcoholic beverages, then client must be >18
- Invoice based payments only when client is credible
- Direct delivery on mobile based payments
- ideal or bank transfer, then deliver after pay
- Deliver order when all in stock
- Client is updated by email.

- Layout story
- Layout rules
- Layout examples
- Add questions along the way

"18+ for alcoholic beverages"

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Add questions along the way

Reds (orange is the new red)

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Layout Examples

Be specific & concrete on the examples

Example

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"order with a coke and a beer
confirmed by 17 year old
confirmation rejected"

Notes on Examples

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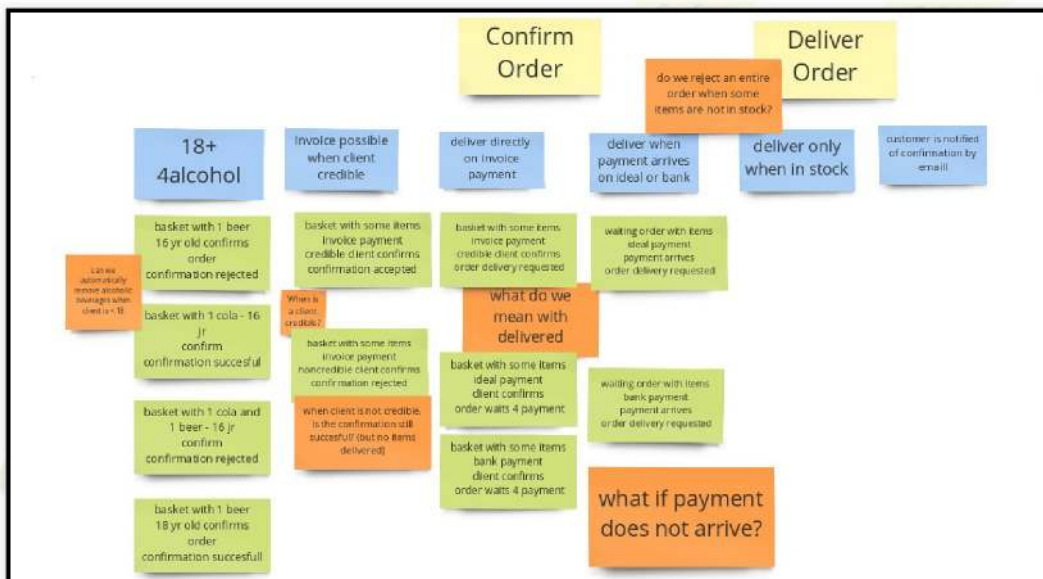
- Sad paths and happy paths
- Sad paths expose ambiguities
- Concrete examples help find questions



Thumb vote

- Too many unknowns
- Too much blue or green
- Sometimes more example mapping sessions

Recommendations

- Goal is not to answer all questions, but to find out what we still don't know.
- Imagine it is 1920
- Do it at last responsible moment
- One pomodoro - one story
- Translate to Gherkin or whatever you use later

Example to Gherkin

```
Scenario:  
Given An Order with "beer" and "cola"  
And My age is "17"  
When I confirm the order  
Then the order is rejected with message "you cannot order alcoholic b
```
